## Protect your baby from Tuberculosis (TB)

TB is a serious, infectious illness that takes a long time to treat

## Your baby is at risk of TB if

- » Someone at home has TB now or has had it in the past
- » Someone at home has come from a country with a high number of TB cases - see list on the back of this sheet
- » Your baby will live in one of these countries for three months or longer
